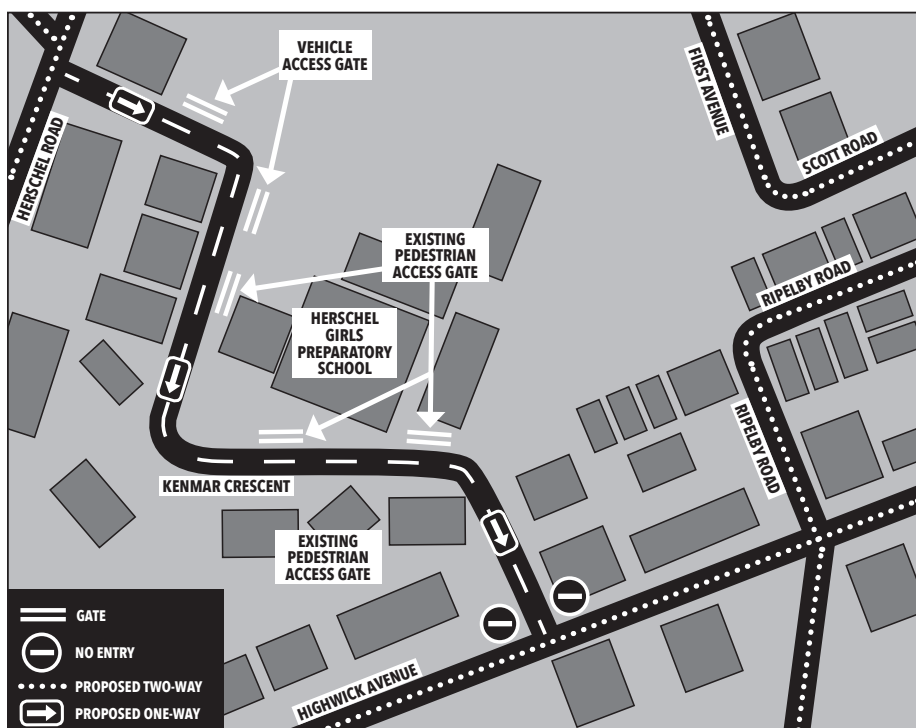




HAVE YOUR SAY! PROPOSED ONE-WAY ROAD CONVERSION OF KENMAR CRESCENT, CLAREMONT

The City of Cape Town's Urban Mobility Directorate invites residents, parents, and road users to comment on a proposal to introduce a permanent one-way system along Kenmar Crescent in Claremont. This proposal is designed to improve traffic flow, enhance safety, and create a more organised road environment around Herschel Girls Preparatory School. The area has many vulnerable road users during busy drop-off and pick-up times. By participating in this process, your insights and feedback can help shape a safer, more efficient neighbourhood for everyone. Please refer to the area map to note the proposed one-way road conversion.



The proposal includes:

- A permanent one-way system on Kenmar Crescent from Herschel Road towards Highwick Avenue.
- Parking bays along Kenmar Crescent in the lane adjacent to the school.
